## Six Pillars of Characters for Competition

**Trustworthiness** – demand integrity, honesty, promise-keeping, loyalty

**Respect** - control violent instincts, demonstrate class; be a good sport, don't talk trash or be boastful, respect officials

**Responsibility** - be accountable, pursue excellence

**Fairness** - never cheat, use recognized standards, don't show partiality or prejudice

**Caring** – show empathy and compassion, be unselfishness

**Citizenship** - play by the rules, acknowledge acts of good sportsmanship

# The T.E.A.M. Strategy for Teaching Character (using a competitive reference)

#### Teach

- The importance of character in competition
- What proper and improper conduct looks like
- # The Six Pillars of Character

### **E**nforce

- **Representation** Praise positive acts of character
- Express disappoint in negative acts of character
- Demand following the rules

**#** Expect respectful conduct

#### **A**dvocate

- Tell young people clearly, continuously and vigorously the importance of character to the 4-H program
- Don't be neutral or noncommittal on issues of character

#### Model

**\*** Lead by example

## Making Good Choices Four Questions to Ask

- 1. Is there possible danger of physical harm to you or anyone else?
- 2. Could you or someone else suffer serious emotional pain?
- 3. Could the decision hurt your reputation?
- 4. Could the decision impede achieving any important goal?

A "yes" answer to any of these questions is an indication you should reconsider your decision.

### Six Pillars of Characters ■

### **Trustworthiness**

- **8** Be honest
- # Don't deceive, cheat or steal
- Be reliable do what you say you'll do
- # Have the courage to do the right thing.
- **8** Build a good reputation
- Be loyal stand by your family and friends

### Respect

- Treat others with respect
- **8** Be tolerant of differences
- # Use good manners, not bad language
- **8** Be considerate of the feelings of others
- **8** Don't threaten, hit or hurt anyone
- Deal peacefully with anger, insults and disagreements

## Responsibility

- **8** Do what you are supposed to do.
- **\*** Persevere; keep on trying!
- Always do your best
- # Use self-control; be self-disciplined
- **8** Be accountable for your choices.
- Think before you act consider the consequence

#### **Fairness**

- # Play by the rules
- # Take turns and share
- **8** Be open-minded; listen to others
- Don't take advantage of others
- **8** Don't blame others carelessly

#### Caring

- **8** Be kind
- **8** Be compassionate and show you care
- Express gratitude
- # Forgive others
- # Help people in need

## Citizenship

- Do your share to make your school and community better
- Cooperate
- **Stay informed; vote**
- **8** Be a good neighbor
- Obey laws and rules
