Supplies Needed:

Photos of items or real items, Situation and Option card, 4-H judging cards, Judging Scale Chart and pencils.

Reasons:

B is first because all four items are needed and appropriate for a two-year old. Two-year-olds like stuffed animals and books and a first aid kit and emergency numbers are necessities when babysitting.

C is second because three of the four items are appropriate; the video game isn't appropriate for a two-year-old. Two-year-olds would be more likely to enjoy rolling and throwing a ball.

A is third because only two of the four items are appropriate. The 50 piece puzzle is too complicated for a two-year-old. The hot wheel car is too small and has too many small parts for a two-year-old.

D is last because none of the four items are appropriate for a two-year-old. A two-year-old shouldn't chew gum and they shouldn't play with make-up, craft paint or scissors.

Situation:

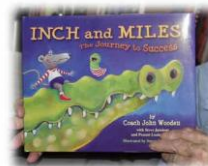
