Supplies Needed:

Situation and Option card, 4-H judging cards, Judging Scale Chart and pencils.

Reasons:

- C** is first because it is appropriate for him to clean the wall. He learns it is wrong to mark on the wall. And having him go to his room to think about his actions is also appropriate.
- A** is second because taking the markers away keeps him from marking on the walls with them and sending him to his room to think about his actions can be good. But having him clean the wall is the best response.
- B** is third because playing t-ball isn't related to marking on the wall at all and he would be letting the entire team down by not participating.
- D** is last because rewarding the writing on the wall with ice cream doesn't teach the child that it was wrong to mark on the wall.
